Chicago fire season 5 episode 9

[This article contains possible spoilers for the season 8 finale of Chicago Fire.] Season 8 of the Chicago Fire came to a somewhat sudden end Wednesday night. The April 15 episode of the hit NBC show saw one of 51 of his own suffering a serious injury that might have ended his career, another crew member struggling with a big loss, and someone else given a huge decision that would see them leaving the firehouse for good. It wasn't exactly the season-ending episode writers originally planned. When the coronavirus pandemic shut down production of Chicago Fire, it meant one of the show's mid-season episodes suddenly had to become the season finale. Fortunately, fans don't have to worry about being left hanging on the fate of everyone at Firehouse 51. The show definitely returns for another season. Chicago Fire has been restored for three more seasons by Jesse Spencer as Matthew Casey, Eamonn Walker as Wallace Boden, and Taylor Kinney as Kelly Severide in Chicago Fire | Adrian S. Burrows Sr./NBC/NCBU Photo Bank via Getty Images in February, NBC announced that it was rebuilding the Chicago Fire for seasons 9, 10 and 11. This means the show will be on the air by 2023. The other Chicago show also got three seasons of renewal. Chicago PD has been renewed through season 10 and Chicago Med through season 8. The renewal was not surprising given the popularity of the franchise. All three shows are among the most watched dramas on television, deadline noted. On Wednesday, 9.33 million people tuned in to watch the Chicago Fire season finale, a record high for the series. When will the Chicago Fire Season 9 premiere? Until we know Chicago Fire will be back, we don't know when season 9 will premiere. New episodes usually begin fanting in late September or early October. But with television production on hold because of coronavirus, is it possible that could be delayed? Earlier filming for a new season has begun in mid-July. In an April 5 tweet, executive producer Derek Haas said the plan was back in the writer's room in early June. We have some ideas because of the storylines we didn't get to finish, but we're going to look at it all with fresh eyes when we return to the writer's room, hopefully on June 1st, he wrote. We're going to really try to do something hopeful and inspiring next season, I think. Hopefully this means that production can resume this summer and Chicago Fire will be back on TV screens as planned this fall. Right now, the city of Chicago, where the Chicago Fire has been shot, is under a stay-at-home order until April 30. What to expect from next season So what future holds the Chicago Fire crew? Haas has said fans can expect a sequel to some unfinished season 8 storylines. I think we can put storylines we're going to start the last three episodes and adapt them to season-starting storylines rather than season-ending ones, he told Entertainment Tonight. I'm waiting for The girls on the Fire storyline kidd and also the Casey/Brett storyline, as their friendship became stronger throughout Brett's birth mother ordeal, he added. Brett and Casey's relationship will also be a factor. Haas has promised to turn up the heat in the department as Brett deals with the fallout from the death of her birth mom. Cast changes are also on the horizon. [Y] I will definitely have more cast shake-ups in the coming season, Haas said. It's just part of how we work to keep our audience on it them. The fifth season of The Office begins with Pam Art School in New York, Ryan returns to Dunder-Mifflin, Dwight and Angela, having an affair behind Andy's back, and Michael meeting the supposed woman of his dreams new human head Holly. Pam finally comes back from art school, gets engaged to Jim and gets pregnant, while Holly and Michael enjoy a short but intense relationship before she is transferred from town. Angela breaks down with both Andy and Dwight, and all three end up alone. After being disrespected by the new vice president, Michael quits Dunder-Mifflin to start his own business, but returns triumphantly when he gets bought, and his rival is expelled from Scranton. Title: Weight LossOriginal Airdate: September 25, 2008 During the eight weeks of summer, Dunder-Mifflin employees take part in a company-wide weight loss challenge that inspires Kelly anorexia and Dwight's new levels of obnoxiousness. Meanwhile, Pam heads off to an art school in New York, and the separation inspires Jim to propose to her a rest stop (she says yes). Michael and Holly continue flirting even as she goes on a few dates with a yoga instructor, and Dwight and Angela continue their illegal affair, but Andy obviously plans his and Angela's wedding to her impossible standards. Ryan returns to Dunder-Mifflin as a temp, filling in for Pam at the reception, and Michael seems to be the only person happy to see him. Title: Business EthicsOriginal Airdate: October 9, 2008 Thanks to the Ryan Scandal at the company, Holly is conducting a business ethics seminar at the office. Michael encourages everyone to confess her ethical misconduct, which leads to Meredith admitting that she regularly sleeps with the seller to get discount supplies and free outback steakhouse coupons. Holly decides that Meredith must stop for this offence, and she and Michael have a tense lunch over which he tries to convince her otherwise. After all, hr at corporate orders thing swept under the carpet. Meanwhile, Jim and Pam announce their engagement to their colleagues who respond with general indifference. Title: Baby ShowerOriginal Airdate: October 16, 2008 Michael plans a baby shower Jan despite the fact that he is not the father of her baby. She appears to have already given birth, toting along with her newborn daughter Astrid. Quite pathetic going forward anyway, with Michael treating Holly meanly so as to break Jan Michael's view that has nothing to do with baby Astrid when he holds him, but when Jan tells him not to date Holly, he goes back to the office and keeps Holly in place; they definitely have a connection and she agrees to go with him. Jim and Pam spend the day having trouble connecting with each other by phone. Title: Crime AidOriginal Airdate: October 23, 2008 Michael and Holly leave the office door unlocked after an hour of tryst, and Dunder-Mifflin is robbed. To compensate for the loss, Michael stages a charity auction with some serious items, including a couple of Bruce Springsteen tickets that don't actually exist. Dwight freaks out about Angela and Andy setting the date for their wedding, and follows Phyllis's advice to give Angela an ultimatum, but Angela doesn't respond. Jim gets paranoid about what Pam could do in New York without him, but stops short of driving out there to check on him. Title: Employee TransferOriginal Airdate: October 30, 2008 After the company discovers that Holly and Michael are dating, they are transferring Holly back to New Hampshire. On the drive from Scranton, she decides that the long-distance relationship with Michael will not work, and even if he asks her to review, they will upset. Confused by Andy, Dwight decides to become a huge Cornell devotee, stocking up on school memorabilia and even sending an application. Jim and Pam have lunch in New York with Jim's brothers, who play a bizarre prank that involves disparaging Pam's efforts to become an artist, but she ingratiates herself by playing along with this rather cruel ruse. Title: Customer SurveyOriginal Airdate: November 6, 2008 Annual Customer Service Surveys are coming, and Jim and Dwight both have negative reports. It turns out that Kelly doctored the results to get back to those who didn't come to her finale party. Michael on the site, but instead of reprimanding Kelly he commiserates with him over hard-persuasive colleagues attending social gatherings. Andy and Angela agree to hold their wedding at Schrutte Farms, giving Dwight another chance to try and woo Angela back. Pam and Jim spend the whole day on the phone together, thanks to tiny headphones that Jim hears when one of Pam's art school friends tries to convince him to stay in New York. Title: Business TripOriginal Airdate: November 13, 2008 Michael, Andy, and Oscar take a business trip to Winnipeg to meet with a client. Michael hooks up with the concierge to try and forget his heartbreak over Holly, while Andy tries to play wingman for Oscar and ends up drunken-dialing angry Angela, who resets his relationship with first base. Pam fails from one of her art school classes, but instead of spending another three months in New York to make it up, she comes home to Scranton to be with Jim. Kelly and Ryan hook up, but he seems less than thrilled about returning him when it becomes clear that Darryl is in no way jealous. Title: Frame TobyOriginal Airdate: November 20, 2008 Toby returns to the office from his time in Costa Rica, and Michael is very unhappy about it. He and Dwight conspire to get Toby fired, trying to goad him sexually harassing Pam or attacking Michael and eventually unsuccessfully framing him for marijuana possession using a bag of lettuce. Ryan dumps Kelly in a very condescending way, which she takes in her usual knowledgeable way. Jim tells Pam that he bought his parents' old house for them, and she seems questionable at first, but eventually tells him that she loves it. Title: SurplusThe initial airdate: On December 4, 2008 Oscar reveals a budget surplus to be spent by the end of the day, and Dunder-Mifflin employees split into two factions on how to use it. One group wants to buy a new copier and the other wants new chairs. This pits Jim and Pam against each other when Jim supports the copier. Eventually, Michael discovers that he can get a bonus if he returns the surplus, but the staff overrules him in favor of the chairs. Out at Schrutte Farms, Dwight humiliates Andy, but goes over Andy and Angela's wedding plans, and then tricks Angela into a possibly bound wedding ceremony. Her answer is to tell Dwight off and then plant a huge, completely free erotic kiss to Andy. Title: Moroccan ChristmasOriginal Airdate: December 11, 2008 Phyllis plans a Moroccan themed Christmas party and uses the opportunity to bully Angela to become her slave, threatening to reveal Angela's affair with Dwight if Angela doesn't do everything Phyllis says. After all, Angela refuses, and Phyllis tells the entire office – except for Andy, who is in another room and is still forgotten. At the party, Meredith gets drunk and sets her hair on fire, leading Michael to the scene of the disastrous intervention of her, and then drag her off to rehab, which both prove unsuccessful. Title: DuelOriginal Airdate: January 15, 2009 Michael finally tells Andy about Angela's affair with Dwight, and Andy and Dwight agree to fight a duel to determine who wins Angela's love. Their rather pathetic face-off, with Dwight brandishing arcane arms and Andy pinning Dwight in his car, doesn't complain to the winner, but each ends so disappointed Angela that neither wants him after the duel is over. Meanwhile, Michael heads to the corporate, where David Wallace wants an explanation of why the Scranton branch is doing so well, but of course Michael has no idea. Title: Prince Family PaperOriginal Airdate: January 22, 2009 David Wallace sends Michael to spy on a family-owned competing paper company, and Michael and Dwight manage to score some serious inside info, posing as potential customers and potential new employees, respectively. Michael is at odds about reporting info and screwing over a friendly family that owns the company, but Dwight convinces him to be ruthless. Although Michael Dwight is gone, the rest of the office holds an elaborate debate to determine whether actress Hilary Swank is hot. Title: Stress ReliefOriginal Airdate: February 1, 2009 Dwight's staged fire (to prove the office lacks preparedness) causes Stanley to have a heart attack to reduce office stress Michael decides to keep fired (for himself). Everyone does their best to insult Michael, and eventually, he takes it to heart. But he bounces back in his usual knowledgeable way, pathetically firing his teammates himself. Jim and Pam are engaged in an impending divorce to Pam's parents, and Andy messues their hued conversations about their eager analysis of the movie-within-the-show starring Jack Black, Cloris Leachman and Jessica Alba in a lame bit of trick casting. Title: Lecture CircuitOriginal Airdate: February 5, 2009 Michael is asked to tour another Dunder-Mifflin branch to talk about his strategy for selling success and take along Pam as his assistant. In Utica, Michael's lecture is a disaster as expected, but Pam encounters newly married and pregnant Karen, and the two seem to bring the past behind them. It inspires Michael to propose a detour so he can reach closure with Holly. Back in Scranton, new party planning committee co-chairs Jim and Dwight have forgotten Kelly's birthday so they're working to get up to it by planning a thoroughly pathetic celebration. And recently one Andy awkwardly tries to woo an unrecpetive client. Title: Lecture Circuit Part 2Original Airdate: February 12, 2009 Michael and Pam take their lecture tour to Nashua to confront Holly while she turns away to the retreat. Instead, Michael encounters Holly's new friend and melts down during his lecture. Later he finds a letter on holly's computer that she wrote to him but never sent, and has Pam read. Pam tells Michael that Holly still has feelings for him. Back in Scranton, Jim and Dwight continue to plan Kelly's pathetic birthday party, and eventually find a way to make him happy. And Angela bothers everyone with her excessive attention and affection for her new cat. Title: Blood DriveOriginal Airdate: March 5, 2009 Valentine's Day makes Michael depressed about his break-up with Holly, so he organizes a mixer for all singles in the office, and invites people from bystanders. Michael hopes to reconnect with the woman he shared the moment with while donating blood, but she never shows up. Non-singles Jim and Pam share a couple's lunch with Phyllis and her husband Bob, who goes very well until Phyllis and Bob sneak off to have sex in the bathroom, making Jim and Pam very uncomfortable. Title: Golden TicketOriginal Airdate: March 12, 2009 Michael comes up with the idea to place five Willy Wonka-esque gold tickets in random paper shipments, giving customers 10 percent discounts. But when one of the biggest customers gets all five, the plan backfires, and Michael tries to get Dwight to make the fall, go for it, but he ends up getting credit when things turn back around. Michael can't accept that, and ultimately, no one comes from looking good. Meanwhile, Andy, Jim, and Pam give Kevin conflicting advice on how to approach the woman he met at the singles mixer, and he finally just ignores them and asks him directly. Title: New BossOriginal Airdate: March 19, 2009 New Regional Vice President Charles Minor (Idris Elba, Wire) comes to Scranton and immediately shakes things by intolerable by any of Michael's tomfoolery. Seeing Michael for what he truly is, a formidable leader, Charles cancels Michael's 15th anniversary party, disbands the party's planning committee and implements sensible office policies. Jim, dressed in a tuxedo confused with Dwight, also ends up looking silly in front of Charles. Michael, fed up with being scarred, goes to New York to complain to David Wallace, but even after being placated, he decides to quit. Title: Two weeksOriginal Airdate: March 26, 2009 After his two weeks in advance, Michael goof's off until he realizes that he has no plans after he leaves Dunder-Mifflin. He impulsively decides to start his own paper company and go around the office trying to recruit people for this new venture, but no one takes him up on the offer. When Charles learns what Michael is doing, he immediately orders Michael out of the office. After spending the whole day learning how to use the new copier and then feeling unappreciated, Pam also impulsively quits, joining Michael in his ill-advised new business. Title: Dream TeamOriginal Airdate: April 9, 2009 Michael and Pam are struggling to start the Michael Scott Paper Company, as Michael is first overwhelmed, and Pam later has serious doubts. They recruit Ed Ryan but fail to invest Michael's former telemarketing co-worker Vikram or provide seed money from Michael's grandmother's investment club. Things do turn around a bit when Michael provides office space in a tiny utility room in the same building as Dunder-Mifflin. At Dunder-Mifflin, everyone tries to kiss up to Charles, pretending to love his favorite sport, football, which ends up backfiring on Jim. Title: Michael Scott Paper CompanyOriginal Airdate: April 9, 2009 Michael, Pam, and Ryan have a stressful first day in their new office, where they bicker with each other, stage a pathetic pancake lunch as they start a party and almost decide to abandon the whole endeavor. By the end of the day, though, they're doing one sale, and things don't seem so bad. At Dunder-Mifflin, Jim still has trouble connecting with Charles, who asks Jim to produce a report he is not familiar with. Dwight and Andy test their newfound friendship when they compete for the new administrator affections. Title: Heavy CompetitionOriginal Airdate: April 16, 2009 Dwight is secretly passing insider information about Dunder-Mifflin to the Michael Scott Paper Company, but after receiving praise for his from Charles, he decides to end it. He and Michael then find themselves dealing with brutal competition to steal or save key accounts. Even Dwight's various acts of sabotage can't keep Michael from

scoring meetings with one of Dwight's biggest clients. At Dunder-Mifflin, Jim starts messing with Andy after Andy means that Jim might be unhappy in his relationship with Pam. But when Michael learns that his discounted rates will leave his company bankrupt in just weeks, he jumps at the possibility of redemption from Dunder-Mifflin, and he, Pema and Ryan are all returning to the company, with Pam now working as a seller. Charles looks silly in front of David Wallace to rely on Dwight over Jim and leave Scranton humiliated, with Michael back in charge. Title: Casual FridayOriginal Airdate: April 30, 2009 With Michael, Ryan, and Pam back in Dunder-Mifflin, there's a bit of tension as Michael gives Ryan and Pam all the customers they stole while at the Michael Scott Paper Company. Other vendors (other than Jim, who stays out of it, hanging out with Creed) almost stage a coup, and Michael ends up giving them his customers back. This leaves only enough customers for another seller, so Ryan has downgraded back to his old temp job. Meanwhile, the number of employees goes too far with the looseness of casual Friday, and Toby decides to rule it out. Title: Café DiscoOriginal Airdate: May 7, 2009 Michael sets up a stereo and espresso machine vacant in Michael Scott Paper Company's office and tries to entice employees to join him in coffee and dancing. At first, it's hard for him to convince people, and Phyllis hurts her back when she's the only one who's joining him. But then Kelly and new administrator Erin get things started, and soon the whole office is dancing a day away. Pam and Jim are planning to sneak away for a quickie wedding, but while dancing, they realize that they really want a big party for their nuptials. Title: Company PicnicOriginal Airdate: May 14, 2009 Annual Dunder-Mifflin company picnic, Michael goes holy and her new friend. Michael and Holly's team created a grueling Slumdog Millionaire parody sketch about the history of Dunder-Mifflin, during which they accidentally discovered the closure of a Buffalo branch. They don't rekind their romance, but they share some meaningful moments that make Michael happy. Jim and Pam get caught up in a volleyball tournament that highlights Jim's renewed rivalry with Charles Minor. A minor injury sends Pam to the hospital, where she discovers that she is pregnant. Pregnant.
